Rural Market Outlook - 2020

Much is written about the amount of land that comes to the market throughout the year in the UK. Comments are regularly made concerning average figures, buyer types and the source of funds looking to invest. Of course statistics can be useful, but they do conceal nuances in the market, especially when you consider that no one acre is the same.

It can however be difficult to quantify sentiment and future outlook; emotions have a huge bearing on whether farms are sold or if buyers are keen to snap them up. Sentiment is personal; therefore decisions are not taken lightly.

Despite the recent uncertainty in the UK, owing to political instability, severe weather events and the health of the wider economy, we know that there are buyers looking for farms, blocks of land and rural estates across the country.

As with any sale or purchase there are exceptions to the rule and the shift in farming support might alter how buyers look at farms and land in future.

The Best

It stands to reason that quality sells. In the case of rural property, this includes:

- **Prime Estates**: those rarely available, in desirable locations
- Commercial farms: good infrastructure, well-farmed and flexible soils
- ◆ The part-time farm: country houses with land, for 'the good life'
- ◆ Land with benefits: versatile soils or angles for development/diversification
- Forestry: woodland, ideally including clear areas for planting

The Rest

Property requiring considerable investment or let land with low yields, viz:

- ♦ Marginal land: needs drainage, careful farming with few cropping options
- ♦ Let estates with limited uplift: low yields and ageing property stock
- ♦ Large houses on small acres: a 'big pile' on a small plot needing work
